

Art discovered on Crete is called minoan Art named after a legendary king who's name was Minos.

The main temple in the Acropolis ("high city") is called Parthenon

Iconic columns were more genteel with spiral decorations (looked a little like horns)

Doric Columns have no decoration at all.

Greek Art is still inspirational for modern architects (Do you know a building that reminds you of greek art?)

Corinthian Columns are beautiful decorated with complex leaf patterns.

The bull was a sacred symbol in minoan religion

The Parthenon was build around 440 B.C. and was used as a temple to honour the goddess Athena

Paintings of dolphins were a popular to use for frescoes and pottery decorations
